Mining Industry Coordinating Council Review

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- aims to identify measures that can help strengthen the enforcement of existing laws, regulations and contracts related to open-pit mining

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Measures to strengthen the regulation of mining practices

- review of the mining regulatory process, in particular, providing new guidelines for activities that involve permanent surface modification and potential long-term rehabilitation
- enhance design and performance standards for open pit mines to take into consideration bestpractice control strategies and technologies

Measures to strengthen the regulation of mining practices

- revisit the provisions of the Mine Rehabilitation Fund to ensure sufficient financial resources for the rehabilitation, restoration and monitoring activities in the mined-out areas
- revisit the sanctions/penalties prescribed for mining violations under the Mining Act, EIA law, Clean Air Act and Clean Water Act

Measures to strengthen the regulation of mining practices

- prioritize, accelerate and scale-up the rehabilitation of abandoned/legacy mines to prevent any further damage to communities and the environment
- conduct periodic review of the go and no-go zones/areas for mining applications
- enhance coordination and ensure active participation of local governments and communities

MGB-Proposed Regulations:

1) Guidelines for Additional Environmental Measures for Operating Surface Metallic Mines; and

2) New Guidelines in the Evaluation and Approval of the Three-Year Development/Construction/Utilization Work Program

1. Guidelines for Additional Environmental Measures for Operating Surface Metallic Mines

Emphasis is on:

"the immediate conduct of progressive rehabilitation of all mined-out areas and the temporary re-vegetation of disturbed areas that are not being utilized in the meantime"

1. Guidelines for Additional Environmental Measures for Operating Surface Metallic Mines

Topsoil and Subsoil Management

All Contractors shall conduct stripping activities for topsoil and subsoil collection which shall be stockpiled separately for revegetation and rehabilitation purposes;

Buffer Zone Management

A 20-meter buffer zone shall be established inward from the mining tenement boundary, and outward from the edges of the normal high waterline of rivers and streams within the tenement area;

1. Guidelines for Additional (cont'd)

- Pier Stockyard as Temporary Stockpile Area for Ore Shipment Pier Stockyards shall be utilized only as temporary stockpile areas for ore prior to loading operations for shipment:
 - for Pier Stockyards with capacity of 100,000 mt 60 days prior to shipment
 - for Pier Stockyards with capacity of more than 100,000 mt - 90 days prior to shipment

1. Guidelines for Additional (cont'd)

Maximum Disturbed Area for Nickel Mines

Scale of Mining Operation	Maximum Disturbed
	Area
1 Million Tons Per Year (TPY) or less	50 has
More than 1 Million but less than 3 Million TPY	60 has
3 Million TPY but less than 5 Million TPY	70 has
5 Million TPY but less than 7 Million TPY	80 has
7 Million TPY but less than 9 Million TPY	90 has
9 Million TPY and up	100 has

- 2. New Guidelines in the Evaluation and Approval of the Three-Year Development/Construction/ Utilization Work Program
 - provides for a new template to incorporate temporary re-vegetation and progressive rehabilitation during the mining operation
 - provides for a 60-day transitory period to allow Contractors with pending, expired and previously approved Three-Year Development/Utilization Work Program to submit a proposed or revised Program

DENR's Proposed Policy Reforms:

- Expedite the approval of Minahang Bayan and processing of SSM Contracts;
- Ensure correct reporting of employment in mining including indirect employment;
- Establish the Private Sector Mining and Environment Fund to address compensation claim for damages and injuries over and above the EPEPF/FMRDF;

DENR's Proposed Policy Reforms:

- Increase the Social Development and Management Fund from 1.5% to 3% of total operating cost and expand its coverage to provide inclusive development in mining communities;
- Ensure the timely release of the share of LGUs; and
- Ensure increasing LGUs' share and granting them direct access similar to existing arrangements with the PEZA.

DENR's Policy Initiatives:

- Strictly monitor the shipments of ores/minerals;
- Strictly implement the Water Code and NWRB policies on the use of water in mining operations;
- Adopt the Programmatic EIA in the implementation of the EIA System for mining projects and related activities;
- Strictly enforce the ban on black sand mining in coastal areas;

DENR's Policy Initiatives:

- Impose mining limits in contiguous areas;
- Prohibit the practice of mining companies suspending their mining operations when metal prices are low;
- Impose limits on the quantity and duration of ore stockpiles; and
- Require third-party audit on ore shipment.

DENR's Monitoring Activities:

- Strengthen the Environment National Task Force to stop illegal mining and environmental violations;
- Use modern technology in monitoring mine operations;
- Review the compliance of mining companies by MICC every two years;
- Deputize the Chamber of Mines as Environment and Natural Resources Group to police their members and mining operating areas;

DENR's Monitoring Activities:

- Blacklist irresponsible mining companies with major violations;
- Cleanse non-moving mining rights holders and review of existing mineral agreement for renegotiation of the terms and conditions;
- Strengthen the Multipartite Monitoring Team; and
- Impose one-strike policy to DENR officials for inability to monitor and take immediate actions on major violations.

To ensure the increase in the contribution of mining to national income:

- Amend EO 79 (Institutionalizing and Implementing Reforms in the Philippine Mining Sector Providing Policies and Guidelines to Ensure Environmental Protection and Responsible Mining in the Utilization of Mineral Resources); and DMO 2016-01 (Audit of all Operating Mines and Moratorium on New Mining Projects);
- Declare high-mineral potential areas as mineral reservations including all existing operating mines;

To ensure the increase in the contribution of mining to national income:

- Strictly monitor payment of taxes by mining companies;
- Promote the establishment of mineral processing plants in the country;
- Encourage mineral processing of all nickel ore; and
- Finalize the national program and road map for the development of value-adding activities and downstream industries for strategic metallic ores.

DENR will also pursue the following policy measures:

- Adopt new technology to maximize mineral ore utilization and environment protection;
- Intensify Information and Communication activities through:
 - Promotion of unified IEC Program on Mining; and
 - Mandatory establishment of private sector mining statistics data and training center;

DENR will also pursue the following policy measures:

- Further review of policies, such as:
 - Mining in critical watersheds; and
 - Mining in small islands which should be subject to conduct of study on carrying capacity.

National Task Force Mining Challenge:

- The enforcement campaign will include other government agencies such as:
 - **>AFP**
 - > PNP
 - >BOC
 - >NBI
 - > PPA
 - >PCG
